RELIEF IN THE REAR

The answer to every guy's prayers

OKAY, I'LL ADMIT THAT RIDING AROUND WITH an overstuffed wallet in my back pocket is, literally, a pain in the hindquarters. And it looks ridiculous to boot. But what to do? Cramming everything into a jacket pocket is a recipe for disaster, and stowing all my billfold crapola in a sissified fanny pack is definitely out of the question. Well,

dear readers and riders, I share the recently discovered answer

with you all: the Money Clamp (\$29.95) from the good folks at Windzone.

Here's how this ingenious little gadget made my life infinitely simpler and more comfortable: a durable, metal

alligator clamp secures a separate leather sleeve. The clamp has twin-hinged wings that flip back so the clamp can be pinched open. The clamp is capable of biting down on, and securing, a sizable wad of

bills. The sleeve will accommodate six credit cards in its dual, tri-

slotted flaps, and can be placed between the clamped bills for safe keeping. Unlike a magnetized money clip, the Money Clamp works through tension. This translates into extra security since there is no magnet to disengage. And there's exactly zero worry about hauling around useless clutter as the

Money Clamp is designed to hold only the essentials: money, license, and assorted cards. I tested my Clamp with nearly two grand in mixed bills and a sleeve full of plastic, and it held every last dollar with ease. That's secure.

Also worth noting, my Money Clamp came equipped with a belt loop and chain, which facilitates safe front pocket carrying. If you're not part of the chain gang, there are several other models to choose from.

Affordably priced and exceedingly practical, the Money Clamp is one of those inventions that I wish I'd come up with. Buy one, and you'll never have another pain in your a\$\$.
